INTRODUCING OUR FUTURE DEACON CANDIDATE



My name is Rene M. Aleria, the fourth of eight children born to Enrique A. Aleria, Sr. and Maria Ramos Modequillo. I am married to Sonia Peñafiel Sumagaysay, and we have three married children—two sons and a daughter. Two of our children are nurses, and one works in Biolab. We are also blessed with seven grandchildren, all residing in Rosenberg, Texas.

From a young age, I felt a deep calling to serve in the Church. I served as an altar server from the fifth grade through high school and initially dreamed of becoming a priest. After a weekend visit to St. Francis Xavier Seminary in Davao City, I took and passed the entrance exam. However, at my father's request, I set aside this path to help with our family business. Although I was disappointed, I respected his wishes. Instead of entering the seminary, I enrolled at Holy Cross of Davao College, where I met Sonia. After completing our studies, we married and began our family life together.

In 2019, the call to serve as a deacon started to grow stronger in my heart, though I set it aside for some time. The COVID-19 pandemic in 2020 further delayed my discernment. Then, in June 2023, a pivotal moment occurred—my grandson, a special child, passed away. At the funeral Mass, a deacon named Billy delivered a moving homily about faith and the resurrection of Jesus, which deeply touched me. After speaking with Deacon Billy about his journey to the diaconate, I felt a renewed and undeniable desire to pursue this path.

Encouraged by this conversation, I spoke with our pastor, Father Nol Docabo. His support and guidance motivated me to join the Diaconate Aspirancy/Discernment Program and to become more involved in parish ministries, including serving as a Eucharistic minister and lector.

After a year of discernment, I was accepted to Immaculate Conception Seminary at Seton Hall University, where I am pursuing a 4-year M.A. in Systematic Theology. I've completed one semester and have seven more to go.

A significant milestone in my journey is fast approaching. On January 26, 2025, I will be formally admitted to candidacy for the Permanent Diaconate along with 33 others at St. John the Evangelist Church in Bergenfield, NJ. The ceremony will be presided over by His Eminence, Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin, Archbishop of Newark. This occasion marks an important step in my calling to serve as a deacon.



The research project of our beautiful stained glass windows was halted this past year through unforeseen circumstances but the Historical Ministry is set to make it happen. After having received some information about a few donors the Committee is confident with the help of all it can be a success. In all, there are 16 windows. Five on each side of the nave, 2 above the confessional, 2 above the gallery of saints, 1 in the vestibule and 1 leading to the choir loft. The names of donors have been memorialized in the windows.

Some surnames are D'Avella, Auriemma, Solimine, Albertine, Zarro and Tribuno. If you have any information about any of these please contact the Parish Office. And if you recognize some names of families you may know, please pass on this information to them. This will be a big help in researching. The Committee is looking for background information about these families. The ultimate goal of the HISTORICAL MINISTRY in conducting this project is to commemorate these families in our new version of the HISTORY OF OUR CHURCH set to be published for our 125th Foundation Anniversary in 2026.
