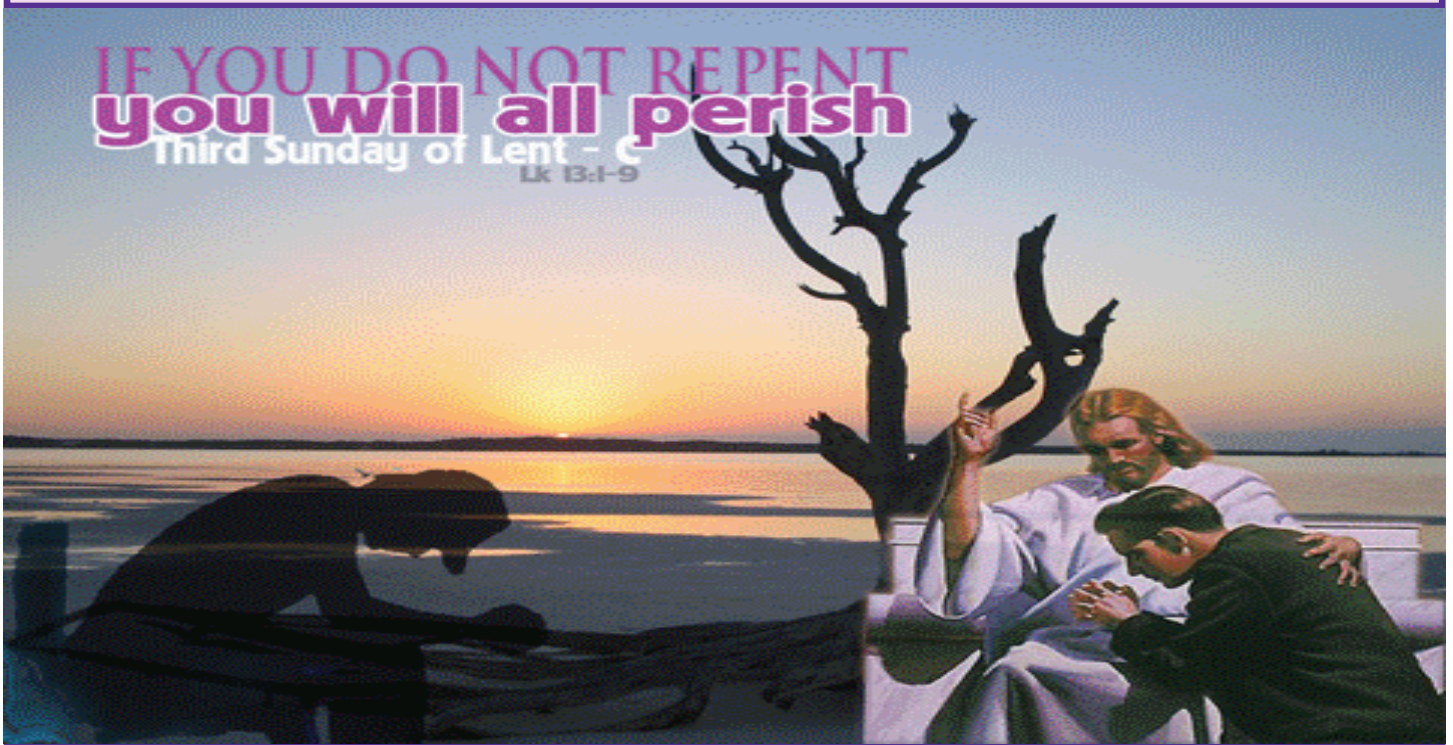

I have a degree in Nursing, and am a certified school nurse and additionally, a certified dental assistant.

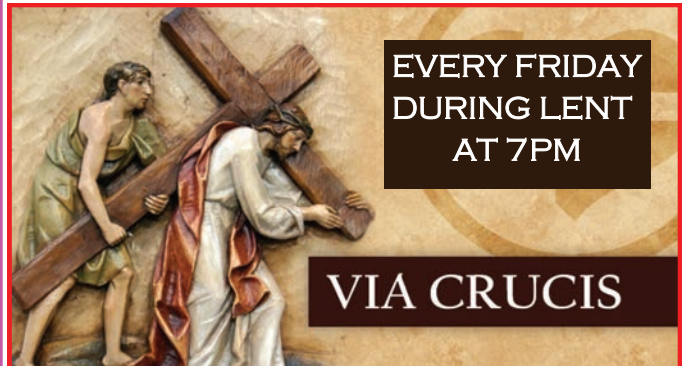
I retired from the Regional Schools of Essex Campus in Newark, under the NJ Department of Children and Families Services. As a school nurse, I had several roles and responsibilities which widened my scope of care for the needs of special students at the Essex Campus. My experience extended to helping not only the students, but also their families and relatives, in physical/mental health, social and educational needs. I worked closely with physicians, social workers, family- and other health-care professionals, in coordinating and using all possible resources to aid them in their respective districts. I took advanced training programs for individualized education, free and appropriate public education, and least-restrictive environment.

Prior to that, I worked for 12 years as psychiatric head nurse (with civil service title) at the Essex County Hospital Rehabilitation Center. I was a member of the psychological health team which collaboratively provided empirical-based treatment therapies for adolescents and adults, including monitoring progress reports to review and create treatment protocols to ameliorate patients' psychiatric difficulties.

I have been an active parishioner of St. Anthony's since the 1990s. I am currently a member of the Rosary Altar Society and the Church choir. I also regularly attend the Bible Study Group and Word Sharing Circle where I occasionally lead praise and worship. I was also secretary of the Fil-Am Community for 4 years before it was merged with the Multicultural Ministry. Outside of St. Anthony's, I am a member of *Bukas Loob sa Diyos*, a Covenant Community of Newark, assigned to the Solo Parents Ministry. Meanwhile, I am also a registered parishioner at Holy Name of Jesus Church in East Orange since 1986, where my husband and I were married, and where my children and grandson were baptized. My twin grandsons, the newest addition to the family, will also be baptized there in the coming weeks.

I am grateful for this opportunity to serve even further here at St. Anthony's, and I look forward to working with the members of the Pastoral Council.

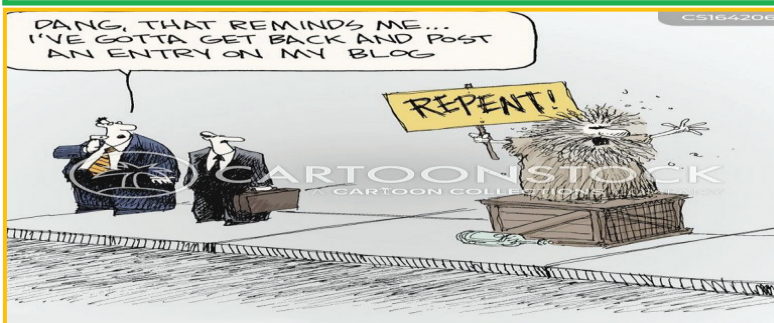
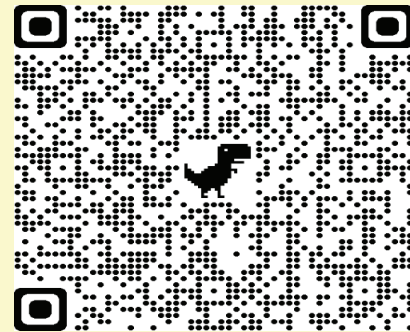

A Kernel of History

(Part 21)

In December of 1995 Father Dennis Coccozza was installed as the fifth Pastor of St. Anthony's. During his Pastorate, Fr. Dennis started up the St. Anthony Festival which we continue to celebrate every year. Then, in 1997, Leonora Ragab (nee Sibilia) our Parish Secretary, (who at that time was owner of a local travel agency), approached Fr. Dennis about possibly organizing a reunion of all St. Anthony School graduates. With the devoted help of many former students including Nicholas Inaugurato, Joanne Gasparinetti and Marcia Rubinaccio, along with many more (some who have passed away now). ALL those on the Planning Committee were graduates from 1960 through 1977. Lastly, without the help of Father Dennis, the very successful event, St. Anthony's Grand Reunion, which turned out over 250 former students celebrating in the old school cafeteria, would not have become a reality.
