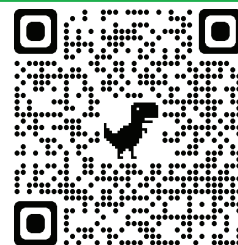

AS SUNDAY RELIGIOUS EDUCATION CLASSES FOR THE SCHOOL YEAR 2022-2023 START, THE RCIC ALSO BEGINS...

What is RCIC?

RCIC refers to the "Rite of Christian Initiation for Children." This is a newer term than RCIA which refers to the "Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults." RCIC is the process for children to be baptized and enter the Catholic Church who have not been baptized as an infant but are now passed the age of reason and know right or wrong and can thus commit actual sins. It is sometimes called the "Rite of Christian Initiation Adapted for Children."

These children seek Christian initiation either at the direction of their parents or guardians or, with parental permissions, on their own initiative. Such children are capable of receiving and nurturing a personal faith and of recognizing an obligation in conscience. But they cannot yet be treated as adults because, at this stage of their lives, they are dependent on their parents or guardians and are still strongly influenced by their companions and their social surroundings.

What is the process and when are the classes?

Children beginning this process are placed into regular Sunday Religious Education classes with their peers. During the first Academic year these children will complete the Rite of Acceptance during a Sunday Mass. During their second Academic year they will continue in classes with their peers and attend classes together for immediate preparation for their Sacraments of Initiation.

When will children receive the sacraments?

All students who are ready and prepared will receive the sacraments at the Easter Vigil in their second Academic year of classes.

How do I enroll my child?

Enrollment for RCIC occurs simultaneously with the enrollment for Sunday Religious Education classes. For this year, the final day of registration will be on **September 11 from 9am to 1130am.**

What is required of a child in RCIC?

Regular attendance at Mass and Sunday classes, as well as active participation in class discussions and activities.

All children need a sponsor who is an active member in the Catholic Church who will be able to be present at the Easter Vigil. There will be various activities for the sponsor and child to complete together throughout the year. If the family is unable to find a sponsor for the child, we will help find a good match in the parish.

Can more than one child from the same family be enrolled in RCIC?

Yes! In many cases when a family is joining the church together, there is more than one child involved. It is highly encouraged to enroll all children at the same time.

What Age Groups Attend RCIC Classes?

Children usually between the ages of 7 and 17 take part in RCIC classes to receive the Sacrament of Baptism and enter the Catholic Church. Children in high school, 18 and older, usually will take part in standard RCIA classes. And children under 7 who are below the age of reason are baptized without the child needing to attend any religious education classes yet. Children who are baptized before the age of reason will simply begin CCD classes when they start their primary education.

Children who are baptized as infants in the Catholic Church, who have reached catechetical age and have not received the sacrament of Eucharist with their peer group follow a process that will lead to the celebration of the Eucharist at a time designated by the parish, preferably a Sunday of the Easter season.

Children who are baptized as infants in the Catholic Church, who have reached catechetical age and have not received the sacrament of Confirmation with their peer group follow a process that will lead to the celebration of the sacrament at the time that Confirmation is administered in the parish by the bishop.

Is the Children's Catechumenate the same as RCIC?

Yes, children's catechumenate is another term to refer to the initiation of children in the life-giving and saving Catholic Faith.

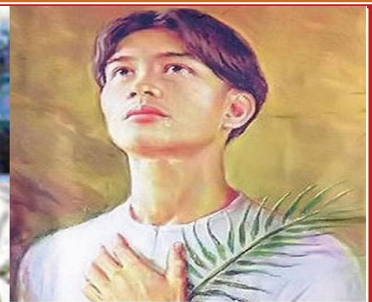

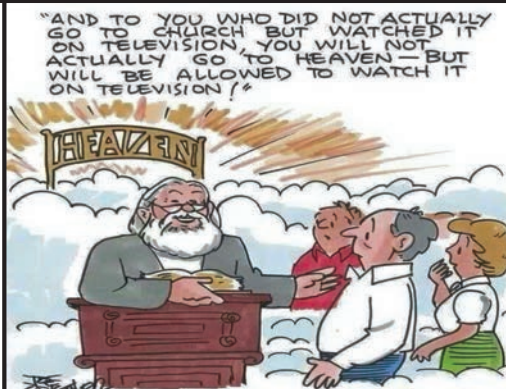

A Kernel of History

(Part 45)

In January 2001, Fr. Ray Francis left for vacation to the Philippines to spend time with his family. As he was on his way back to the United States, sadly for our Parish, he suffered a fatal heart attack on January 19, 2001. He was buried in the Philippines. A special Memorial Mass was held at St. Anthony's. Rev. John Connor was appointed Administrator in February. Fr. Connor's full-time position was with the Archdiocesan Tribunal Office. His responsibilities at St. Anthony's would be managing Parish financials. At the same time, the Pastoral Staff included Fr. Neil Collins, Fr. Sal Malanga, and Deacon Lou Accocella. During this transition period, Bishop Arthur Serratelli was invited to celebrate Mass on Easter Sunday. St. Anthony's was Bishop Serratelli's first assignment as a priest from 1969-1970. Parish life continued normal as the Holy Name Society held their 70th Annual Mother's Day Communion Breakfast in May with Bob Sibilis as MC as usual. Then in June the Annual Feast of St. Anthony was held for the very first time on Franklin Street June 8, 9 and 10. On June 15, 2001, Fr. Joseph Ferraro replaced Fr. John Connor as Administrator. St. Anthony's was Fr. Joe's home parish. Fr. Neil Collins retired after 16 years of service at St. Anthony's, then, in July, Fr. Edito Gamallo was assigned as the new Parochial Vicar.

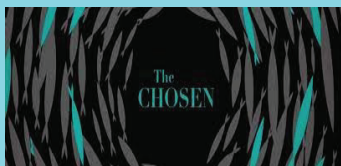
