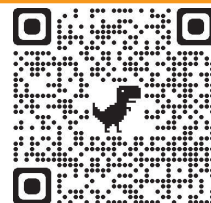

A Kernel of History

(Part 4)

In 1936, under the direction of Father Alessi, a 7 room house at the corner of Lake and Franklin Streets was purchased for \$6000. He was able to get permission from the Diocese to allow the construction of a new church. This was approved with the condition that the house and the old church be torn down and destroyed but these instructions were apparently not heeded because in 1976 (40 years later) the two structures were still standing. Once the new church was built the old church was used as a Parish Center, and the house was moved behind the old church and used as a convent for the Religious Teachers Filipini until 1955. After a census was taken, in 1937, it was determined that St. Anthony of Padua church consisted of 984 families which included 2,819 adults and 1,905 children. Construction of the new church began and the architect was Anthony J. Da Pace of NYC. The cost of the edifice was \$85,000 and consisted of buff tapestry brick with limestone trim with a seating capacity of 500. In June of that year, Fr. Alessi was granted his request for an associate priest and Fr. Thomas A. Gillick was assigned to the parish. Somewhat of a challenge for him, being Irish in an Italian parish, he overcame it by walking the streets and speaking with the children. He encouraged the young boys to come to church and recruited them as Altar Servers. He gave instructions for confirmation and gave those attending a good basis upon which to build their faith. Finally, on October 31, 1937 at 3:00 PM Bishop Thomas Walsh of the Newark Diocese laid the cornerstone of the new church at an official ceremony. The first Mass was celebrated in the new church on June 19, 1938.

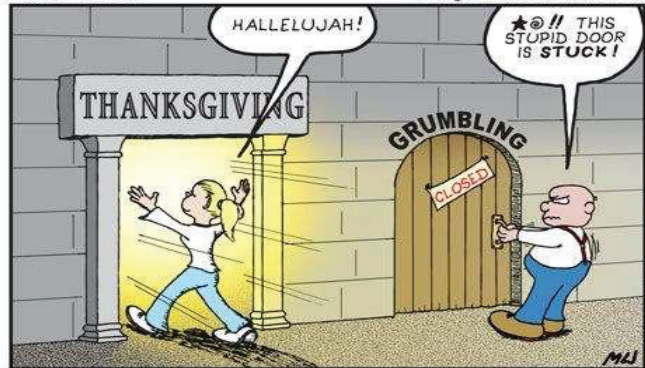
