

PRAYER TO SANTO NIÑO

O miraculous Santo Nino, prostrate before Your sacred Image, we beseech You to cast a merciful look on our troubled hearts. Let Your tender love, so inclined to pity, be softened at our prayers, and grant us that grace for which we ardently implore You. Take from us all unbearable affliction and despair.

For Your sacred infancy's sake hear our prayers and send us consolation and aid that we may praise You, with the Father and the Holy Spirit, forever and ever. Amen.

Baptism of the Lord Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

Today we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. In today's Gospel, as in the other Gospel accounts of Jesus' baptism, we hear John the Baptist address the confusion of the people who thought that John might be the Messiah. In response, John contrasts the baptism that he performs with the Baptism that Jesus will inaugurate. John the Baptist says that he has baptized with water, but that someone will come and baptize with the Holy Spirit. The type of baptism that John performed was not yet a Christian Baptism; it was a preparation for Christian Baptism through which sins are forgiven and the gift of the Holy Spirit is received.

The baptism of Jesus is reported in each of the three Synoptic Gospels—Matthew, Mark, and Luke. Clearly, it was an event of great significance for Jesus and for the early Christian community. The Evangelists Mark and Luke report the story from Jesus' perspective; the voice from heaven is addressed to Jesus. Compare this to Matthew's Gospel in which the voice from heaven speaks to everyone. In Luke, however, the Holy Spirit descends upon Jesus during his time of prayer after his baptism. Through his Gospel, Luke will show Jesus to be a person of prayer who withdraws regularly from the crowds and his disciples to pray to his Father.

The baptism of Jesus is considered a manifestation of God in Jesus, another "epiphany." On this, the last day of the Christmas season, our Gospel reveals to us Jesus' relation to God: the son of Mary and Joseph is also God's own Son. In Luke's Gospel, all three members of the Trinity are manifested here: God the Father in the voice, the Holy Spirit descending, and Jesus the Son. At the beginning of his Gospel, Luke is communicating to us important information about the identity of Jesus. In the verses that follow, Luke lists the genealogy of Jesus, tracing Jesus' ancestry back to the first person, Adam, who is also identified as the son of God. We, the children of Adam and Eve, are again made children of God through Baptism.

Last year our parish survey was put on hold. We hope to achieve our goal of conducting the survey this year, 2025, to determine how many active parishioners are actually registered. It is important that you register as a parishioner because there will be times when you might need certification, for example, to serve as a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation; or you may need to register your child for

CCD or prepare for marriage. We are also updating our data base, as we would like to go as digital as possible. In this way we can reduce unnecessary paperwork and mailings by communicating by phone, text or email. And, it is so important that we keep our parishioner and sacramental records in perfect order. You can be a big help in this project by completing our Parish Survey. We are preparing to distribute the survey within the coming months, so please keep this in mind. Your cooperation in this project will go far in making this survey a huge success.



The research project of our beautiful stained glass windows was halted this past year through unforeseen circumstances but the Historical Ministry is set to make it happen. After having received some information about a few donors the Committee is confident with the help of all it can be a success. In all, there are 16 windows. Five on each side of the nave, 2 above the confessional, 2 above the gallery of saints, 1 in the vestibule and 1 leading to the choir loft. The names of donors have been memorialized in the windows.

Some surnames are D'Avella, Auriemma, Solimine, Albertine, Zarro and Tribuno. If you have any information about any of these please contact the Parish Office. And if you recognize some names of families you may know, please pass on this information to them. This will be a big help in researching. The Committee is

looking for background information about these families. The ultimate goal of the HISTORICAL MINISTRY in conducting this project is to commemorate these families in our new version of the HISTORY OF OUR CHURCH set to be published for our 125th Foundation Anniversary in 2026.
