

CATECHESES ON THE HOLY MASS

(Part 6)

What is a homily?

A homily is a commentary, or a discussion delivered by a priest or deacon after the reading of scripture. The word homily is frequently used in the Roman Catholic, Eastern Orthodox, Anglican and Lutheran religions. The word homily is derived from the Greek word *homilia*, which means conversation. A sermon is a speech or discourse on religion or morals.

In the homily, the priest follows the example of Christ on the road to Emmaus, explaining and interpreting the Scriptures. Sometimes this interpretation is biblical, sometimes theological, sometimes moral or catechetical. Always, however, again in imitation of the Emmaus encounter (where Christ "was made known ... in the Breaking of the Bread"), it should prepare the congregation for or point us toward what is about to follow: the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

It means more than just a sermon or a talk about how we are to live or what we are to believe. The homily takes that word and brings it to our life situation today. Just as a large piece of bread is broken to feed individual persons, the word of God must be broken open so it can be received and digested by the congregation.

Should a homily be given at every Mass?

A priest is required to preach a homily on Sundays and Holy Days in accordance with the Catholic Canon Laws that follow:

767 §1. "Among the forms of preaching, the homily, which is part of the liturgy itself and is reserved to a priest or deacon, is preeminent; in the homily the mysteries of faith and the norms of Christian life are to be explained from the sacred text during the course of the liturgical year."

767 §2. "A homily must be given at all Masses on Sundays and holy days of obligation which are celebrated with a congregation, and it cannot be omitted except for a grave cause."

767 §3. "It is strongly recommended that if there is a sufficient congregation, a homily is to be given even at Masses celebrated during the week, especially during the time of Advent and Lent or on the occasion of some feast day or a sorrowful event."

767 §4. "It is for the pastor or rector of a church to take care that these prescripts are observed conscientiously."

In summary, in Masses during the week, a homily is not obliged, only recommended. But it must be given on Sundays and holy days of obligation.

What is the ideal length of a homily? Is there any rule of thumb when it comes to the length of homilies?

There isn't a set time. Some priests give very concise homilies and try to make their points in just a few minutes. There are also some who give in-depth teachings that take much longer.

The length of the homily varies in different cultures. For example, some parts in Africa people travel so far to get to Mass and because that was so central as the most important thing of the week for all the people who attended (like it should be for all of us), priests are expected to preach for a very long time—often for an hour with substantial teaching. And if they did anything less than that, the people would be upset like they were shortchanged because many of them had walked for hours to get to the Mass.

It is different here in the United States. Our parish masses are usually scheduled closely together and don't allow for a homily to go on for an hour. But, if we did that here in the United States, many, if not all, people would run us out on a rail. Some people say that Sunday Mass homilies should be basically the time between commercial breaks in a television series, so that's twelve minutes at the most; and, for daily Mass, homilies should be kept within 3-5 minutes. Pope Francis has recommended to priests to cut the length of the homily down to just seven minutes on Sundays and holy days of obligation.
